Four Wheel Drive Victoria Funding Secured

At last weeks Ministerial 4WD Advisory meeting we signed paperwork securing a further 3 years funding commencing July 1st 2019. This is an amazing piece of news given we are so far from the start of the next financial year and absolutely shows the respect and rapport we have with the Government and their land managers.

This of course comes on top of the major funding announcement made by the Andrews government to commit \$105.6 million to create more campgrounds, better four-wheel drive tracks and new walking trails, to give people more opportunities to enjoy the beautiful scenery that Victoria has to offer.





Victorian Election Outcome

Just prior to the recent election Four Wheel Drive Victoria were invited down to Hammond Road Camp ground near Anglesea for a major announcement regarding four wheel driving, 4WD tracks, camping fees and funding for major projects that effect our recreation.

You may have seen some of us in the background on the TV News with Daniel Andrews and Lily D'Ambrosio announcing a \$105.6 million package for funding of the program. The meeting by chance also gave us the opportunity to actually discuss our issues and activities directly with both the Premier and the Environment Minister

Now that we know the result of the election, we can confirm that an allocation of \$10.5 million to improve 4WD tracks and facilities around the state will include \$9.5 million to rejuvenate Victoria's seven iconic 4WD Adventures – Davies Plain Drive, Grampians Drive, Mallee Drive, Otway's Drive, River Red Gum Drive, Snowy River Drive and Wonnangatta Drive. 4WD track maintenance and campsite works will also be



undertaken on the High Country touring route, Backroad Tour, Wombat 4WD Tour, Circuit Road Forest Drive, Haunted Steam Track and Nunniong Plains Track. The package also included funding for creation of 30 more campsites and maintenance and upgrading of existing campsites and reduction in Parks Victoria camping fees. All the details of this package are on our FWDV website

Central West Investigation Draft Report

Thank you to all the 4WD clubs that sent in submissions to us (4 of 86 clubs) and to those that sent submissions directly to VEAC. Considering the long lead time and the substantial information that was communicated by us we did expect more input from the clubs. Four Wheel Drive Victoria have sent in a detailed submission on behalf of our members and we are now waiting for the final report. It will be interesting to see what the final report looks like and if our comments have been taken into account. Prior to the deadline and after consultation with Four Wheel Drive Victoria, VEAC did schedule an additional information meeting in Collingwood to allow interested city based people to visit and obtain more information. VEAC also extended the submission deadline for submissions from 31 October to Monday 10 December.

The resort management boards new structure includes Board members that sit on other resort management boards eg; Falls Creek and Mt Hotham and we hope that this cross pollination will work to spreading the good work of the Association, our relationships with land managers.

MVO Track Access

We remind you all that affiliated Clubs and Trip Leaders can access MVO tracks and plan trips that include them. There is a process to be followed to obtain access approval and details are obtainable from Four Wheel Drive Victoria.

Once access has been granted from Parks Victoria and FWDV, you are entitled to enjoy a unique 4WD trip in the bush, as only FWDV affiliated club members are allowed access to MVO tracks.





Trip Leaders and clubs are encouraged to research which tracks are available and plan club trips accessing these MVO tracks as historically not many clubs have taken up the opportunity. Our second Regional Representative's meeting for 2018 was held in Mansfield.

The weekend started off with the customary drive in the surrounding district and was led and tailed by members of the Mansfield Alpine Four wheel drive Club – Alison & Brian McLaughlin and Karen & Richard Jarvis.

The group visited The Paps and then drove a loop in the Delatite Arm of the Eildon State Park out of Goughs Bay. Most members of the convoy had not visited or driven these two areas and it was a great showcase of different 'high country'. There were, spectacular views and some good low range driving. Everyone gathered for dinner at the Delatite Hotel in Mansfield on Saturday night before all meeting at the DELWP & Parks Vic offices for the official meeting on Sunday.

The Sunday meeting was, once again, a terrific few hours of news and updates by Rangers and Club members from around the State on track maintenance programs, camp ground improvements, up and coming track clearing plans, a major project to reduce bushfire risk with works



on tracks, helipads and hazardous trees, the extended seasonal closures in the high country due to bumper snow season and the continuous problems and consequences of unattended campfires and vandalism of gates. The Regional Rep meetings are always interesting and a great opportunity to hear the latest from our Rangers, join in discussion and generally gain a better understanding of management issues in our parks and forests. The next meeting will be held in May 2019 at Heyfield.

Track Clearing

A huge thank you to all the clubs that were involved in track clearing activities over the last few weeks. Many 4WD Club volunteers devoted substantial time and effort in clearing tracks for everyone to enjoy. Our volunteer work is greatly appreciated by the land managers and rangers in the field so well done everyone.





On almost every trip we take, there are tracks that need clearing. This in fact happens all year round, not just on the designated weekends prior to the season opening. If you and your fellow members find yourself clearing tracks, record your efforts including where you have cleared and send them through to Geoff Kenafacke or the office so we capture your brilliant work.

Horse Shoe Bend Thompson River Closure

Early in 2019 the WGCMA will start work on a project to create a fishway at Horseshoe Bend on the Thomson River. Unfortunately that means the area will be closed to the public from Feb – June 2019. We are trying to establish if the nearby Coopers creek Campground will be effected so watch our social media for any updates.

The Thomson River Fishway is an innovative project designed to improve the health of the Thomson River by reconnecting the flow around Horseshoe Bend. Reinstating the flow will have major benefits for the health of the Thomson River. The project will create access to over 80km of pristine upstream habitat for fish. It can also be thought of as an ecological insurance policy, as opening habitat for fish grows their populations, which makes them more resilient to changes throughout the catchment. Camp Host Program

Many clubs have recently run successful Camp Hosts at popular camping areas around the state and we thank the many volunteers who have been involved.



Camp Host supports the principle that 4WD Clubs are a lot better at educating and policing not only their own members, but the general public also pursuing their recreation. This is provided in a non-confrontational manner, thus increasing the effect it has on individuals who are more open to learning about reducing their impact on the environment. The 4WD Camp Host program places volunteers from 4WD clubs

at selected camp sites in parks and forests across Victoria to provide visitors with local information on four wheel driving as well as park based information.

Some 35 sites are available for clubs to be part of the camp host program. Visitors to a Camp Host site are given information regarding environmental awareness and education which they can take away with them and utilise on future trips.





One of the roles of a Camp Host Volunteer is to conduct visitor surveys, from which Four Wheel Drive Victoria produce a detailed report for the Alpine Advisory Committee, Parks Victoria, DELWP and Government about the outcomes.

More To Explore APP

The More To Explore app has just been updated and includes track data, campsite info, photos, track ratings and guide which has been previously provided by some of our club members. The track information in the app is limited at this stage so we are asking our members for help in collating more tracks into the App. Four Wheel Drive Victoria is working with DELWP in supporting this App as part of our key volunteer work projects.

So if you could assist by collecting some track data next time you are out on the tracks it would be greatly appreciated. We don't need any data from National Parks at this stage, particularly from State Forests. This app works really well and will become an asset for all four wheel drivers and recreational users of both State Forests and National Parks. Please make sure you log your hours and klms traveled so we can include them in our volunteer hours log.

So! The information we require is location or name of forest, track name and if possible track log files, track difficulty rating using our track rating guide on www.fwdvictoria.org.au, Photos of the track showing the most challenging section to give the user an idea of the track conditions, any other information such as points of interest, scenic spots and picnic areas etc. Have a play in the App yourself and you can see what information is already there.

The More to Explore App. was recently launched by DELWP & Forest Fire Management it is ideal for Bushwalkers, Four Wheel Drivers, Fishers etc. to plan and enjoy the great outdoors in Victoria and covers all our State Forest areas. National Parks will be included later.

The app provides an interactive map, descriptive information and photos of our visitor sites and recreational trails and enables you to download maps for use offline when out of mobile phone range. The data is maintained directly by Forest Fire Management Victoria field staff and provides the latest and most up-to-date information available (includes the latest information on any visitor site or trail closures).
