Dargo & Licola Fires

Current Situation

The fires at Licola (Mt Margaret Track) and Hibernia (Black Snake Creek) have been contained.

The fire at Mt Darling (Cynthia Range Track) is not yet under control. There is some active fire in the remote areas and the remaining fire activity is well within containment lines and poses no threat to the community.

The fires have not grown in size.

The community can expect to see a lot of activity and movement of aircraft and heavy machinery around the area as they continue to consolidate containment lines.

Weather Forecast

Friday 29 March - Showers developing, possible storms. Max 28

Saturday 30 March - Shower or two – Min 9 – Max 17 Sunday 31 March - Possible shower – Min 9 – Max 19 Monday 1 April - Cloudy – Min 9 – Max 21

Tourism

All areas of the foothills and Southern Alps area of the Alpine National Park have been closed due to the fires and all camping areas remain closed in this area.

The majority of Gippsland and Alpine Region are open for business and the public are actively encouraged to visit and support local businesses in the region.

The Dargo Road is also open as far as Dargo.

Road & Park Closures - Licola

The following road remains closed:

• Tamboritha Road, Licola access for residents only)

All 4WD Tracks will remain closed within the fire impacted area over the school holidays and Easter.

Road & Park Closures - Dargo

The following roads remain closed:

- Wonnangatta Road Shortcut Road, Dargo
- Dargo High Plains Road at Mt Hurley track, Dargo

The Dargo High Plains Rd remains closed however this road and the Upper Dargo road are planned to re-open from Thursday 4 April 2019, subject to completion of necessary works.

No access is available to the Southern Alps and Foothill areas of the Alpine National Park and State Forest campgrounds.

All 4WD Tracks will remain closed within the fire impacted area over the school holidays and Easter.

Please ensure compliance with traffic management points and road closures. Parts of the Alpine National Park and neighbouring State Forest areas remain closed to the public.

Motorists are requested to keep an eye out for the extra heavy machinery, trucks and fire crews on the road and take it easy on your way up and down the hill.

Wellington Shire Council Pop-Up Recovery centres

What will be on offer?

- Information on all the supports currently available for people who have been stressed by bushfire and or drought.
- A chance for people to provide any creative ideas for events or activities on how to help the broader community get through these challenging times.
- An opportunity for one to one conversations with various professionals experienced in insurance, counselling, creative recovery and keeping safe and healthy while bushfires and drought are active in our region.

Case Support – Recovery Assistance

Warning about use of river water for domestic and stock purposes from Southern Rural Water

Many people in the Licola and Dargo fires area rely on river water for domestic and stock use.

Southern Rural Water reminds you that rivers are not treated and are not always suitable for humans or stock.

During and after fires, river water can be contaminated with fire-fighting chemicals, smoke and burnt material, making it toxic for humans.

The water in the recently refurbished bore at the Dargo Recreation Reserve is available for use but has not been tested or treated. If you wish to use this water, you must determine whether it is suitable for the purpose you need.
