The Eastern Victoria Geoscience Initiative, seismic survey continues to make good progress and has covered over 185km to date and the EVGI web page has been updated with local road traffic management potential delays and/or detours.

Based on an average of 10-13kms per day the EVGI web site has provided the list of roads where the Vibroseis trucks will be travelling along over the next week as well as possible track detours and delays over the Easter Long Weekend.

The survey is expected to be in the Tallangatta Valley from Sat 24 March on the Callaghan Creek Track. Based on the current pace, the survey (subject to weather conditions) is expected to be in the Nariel Valley/Tom Groggin over the Easter Long Weekend. This is the final leg of Line 1.

Advertisements have been placed in the Border Mail, Myrtleford Times and Corryong Courier to advise of possible track detours and delays.

The 4WD Association of Victoria have also advised their affiliated clubs of the possible detours and I have received a number of phone calls from the 4WD clubs confirming which tracks are impacted.

The survey base camp have moved from Myrtleford to Dartmouth and next week move to Corryong.
